Papers & Presentation

Papers available on the KBS2002 web-site

Presenters are expected to bring with them copies of the papers available on the KBS2002 web-site that they will need at the symposium. Only a small number of these papers will be available at the Symposium Centre.

Late papers

Participants who have not submitted their papers via Internet by May 24th Friday noon (Paris time) must bring 160 copies with them to the conference, and please see to it that your discussant receives a copy on time.

Format & photocopying (late papers)

Please bring copies of your paper in single-spaced, two-sided format in order to reduce the volume of paper that you and your symposium colleagues need to transport. Photocopying charges at the ASIEM are high and there will not be symposium resources to cover on-site copying costs; therefore please photocopy your paper before you leave home.

Presentation equipment

All sessions schedule for June 2nd and for the main symposium will have slide & overhead equipment. If you wish to use Power Point, please plan to bring your own LCD equipment.

Guidelines for Speakers, Discussants and Chairpersons

Prior to each session, **speakers and discussants** are asked to locate the chairperson of his/her session.

The **chairperson** should check that all speakers and discussants have arrived before opening the session. If speakers do not arrive promptly, the chairperson may re-arrange the order of the session presentations. Chairpersons are asked to **begin the session on time**. The chairperson should provide a brief introduction (name and affiliation of the presenter, names of co-authors, title of the paper).

The Main Program indicates the order of presentations and the discussants assigned to the papers. Please note that the two papers (occasionally one) listed just above the discussant's name are the papers he or she is expected to comment on.

The **format of a session**. Each session is divided into two parts. Each part includes two presentations and a comment by a discussant. Ten minutes is allotted for each presentation and 10 for the discussant, followed by 15 minutes for questions, comments and discussion from the audience. This yields a total of 90 minutes for the entire session (45 min x 2). **Chairpersons, speakers and discussants** for each session are encouraged to speak to one another beforehand to clarify this procedure.

As the time frame is very tight, it is very important to respect the time allotted.

Chairpersons will be provided with cards to indicate “3 minutes remaining”, “1 minute remaining” and “time is up”. Sessions will not be extended into the breaks. *Exceeding the time limit means that the following presentations will have to be cut short. Please be considerate of your colleagues (those presenting after you and those in the audience) and adhere to the time limit.*

Discussants are asked to draw out comparative themes in the presentations and raise questions to open the discussion. This will increase the quality of the discussion.

Thank you for your contribution in presenting a paper, chairing a session or being a discussant.

ALCOHOL-RELATED CRASHES: HOW TO CUT THEM DOWN? (4th edition: practical challenges).

General orientation to transportation in Paris

There are four major subway lines (RER line A, B, C and D), and the metro (RATP) inside Paris (line 1 to line 14); there are also bus lines (RATP). The one-way cash fare is about 1.5 euros.

Arriving by Air

1. ROISSY Charles de Gaulle (CDG) Airport

1.1 by metro

- a) Take the RER B (Saint-Rémy-les-Chevreuses direction) from CDG airport to Denfert-Rochereau
- b) Take the Metro line 10 (Boulogne - Pont de St-Cloud direction) from Denfert-Rochereau to Segur

1.2 by bus + metro

- a) Take the ROISSYBUS (price : 8 euros) from CDG airport to Opera
- b) Take the Metro line 8 (Balard direction) from Opera to La Motte Picquet - Grenelle
- c) Take the Metro line 10 (Gare d'Austerlitz direction) from La Motte Picquet - Grenelle to Segur

1.3 by Taxi

The one-way cash fare is about 30 to 35 euros (credit cards are often taken)

2. ORLY Airport

2.1 by metro

- a) Take the RER C (Champ de Mars - Tour Eiffel direction) from Orly Airport (Pont de Rungis) to Gare d'Austerlitz
- b) Take the Metro line 10 (Boulogne - Pont de St-Cloud direction) from Gare d'Austerlitz to Segur

2.2 by bus + metro

- a) Take the ORLYBUS (price : 5.50 euros) from Orly Airport to Denfert-Rochereau
- b) Take the Metro line 8 (Balard direction) from Opera to La Motte Picquet - Grenelle
- c) Take the Metro line 10 (Gare d'Austerlitz direction) from La Motte Picquet - Grenelle to Segur

2.3 by Taxi

The one-way cash fare is about 20 euros (credit cards are often taken)

Arriving by Train

1. Gare du Nord

Taxi from Gare du Nord to ASIEM is about 12 euros

By metro:

- RER line B (St Rémy les chevreuses direction) from Gare du Nord to Denfert-Rochereau
- Metro line 6 (Charles de Gaulle-Etoile direction) from Denfert-Rochereau to Sèvre-Lecourbe

2. *Gare Montparnasse*

Taxi from Gare Montparnasse to ASIEM is about 12 euros

By metro:

Metro line 6 (Charles de Gaulle-Etoile direction) from Gare Montparnasse to Sèvre-Lecourbe

Go to Avenue de Breteuil, and, Place Breteuil, turn on your left in the Avenue de Saxe

The “rue de Lapparent” is about 5 mn on your left

About Tipping

Tips are included in meal and taxi charges. In restaurants, a tip can be suggested if you want.

About the weather

During June, temperatures in Paris may range between 8C at night to 25C during the date. There may be some rain, but usually only briefs showers. Evenings may be cool and days may be warm.
